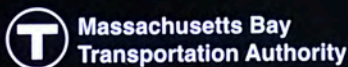


# Riders are part of the Solution

## How to respond to Sexual Harassment or Assault

The MBTA wants all passengers to have a safe ride. All forms of sexual harassment and assault are taken seriously by the MBTA.

If you see someone exposing themselves, harassing others, touching passengers inappropriately without consent, taking inappropriate photos or anything that concerns you, please take one or more of the following steps:

- Draw attention to their inappropriate behavior
- Move away from the offender, if possible
- Ask the person being targeted if they need help or assistance
- Call 911, if you need immediate help
- Take a photo or video if you can without compromising your safety
- Use the **MBTA See Say** app or Text 873873 to report the incident

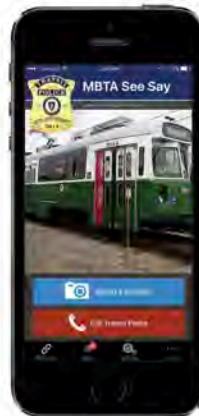
